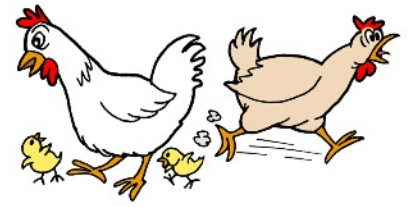


Links to local attractions
